We're half way through the school year and what a busy place our classroom has been. We spent the month of December preparing for Christmas and finished our work with colors. The children enjoyed learning rhymes and making puppets to go along with each color. Our room was crowded on Grandparent's Day. Thank you to all the grandparents for arranging your schedules so you could visit with us. It was a great morning!

In January we started learning a new shape each week. The children are working on a shape book which they will bring home at the end of February. January's cold temperatures made it difficult to go outside, but they were perfect for talking about winter. We learned how to dress for the cold weather and made some fun art projects including snowflakes, snowmen and finally some snow with shaving cream and glue.

Christine Gephart from the Green Lane Nature Center visited our classroom and read a story about animals in winter. She brought a box of different types of nuts, berries, deer antlers and other natural



things for the children to explore. I encourage you to visit the nature center or attend some of the family events in the brochure the children brought home.

We had fun with Jan Brett's beautifully illustrated stories *The Hat* and *The Mitten*. There were a surprising variety of hats and the children were happy to use their language skills to share something about their special hat.

In February we will be learning about the groundhog, the post office, how to mail a letter and bears. Information about exchanging Valentines and a teddy bear picnic will be coming home soon. Your children have grown so much and I am looking forward to the second half of the school year and talking with you about your child's progress during our conference in March.

## Music & Spanish Classes

It is hard to believe that we are halfway through our school year. We have established some great routines in Music and Spanish classes, and each session is new and exciting.

During the month of January, our music classes were spent learning about the different families of instruments - percussion, wind, string, and keyboard. We had a lot of fun exploring actual instruments, and listening to different kinds of music using each family. Upcoming themes in our music classes will be rhyming words in songs, and opposites, such as loud and soft.



We have covered the basics in Spanish - colors, numbers, and shapes - and it is delightful to watch the students as they master the words we use in class, and to hear them using their Spanish color, number, and shape words in their classroom as well as mine! Now we are exploring words for the things we see around us. Right now we are talking about our house and the things we see in

it. Look for your children to come home with words about their faces and their clothing in the next several weeks.

We are excited to once again be offering a 2-year-old class beginning March 1. Mrs. Ann Longacre has been teaching this class for the past 2 years and has done an incredible job with the help of parent volunteers.
