FOUR-YEAR-OLD CLASS - Mrs. Gehman

It has been a good start to the new school year. The four-year-old classes have learned the classroom routine and are enjoying the many activities available in the classroom. The first week of school, we read <u>Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?</u> by Bill Martin Jr., identified colors, made a project and played some games related to that book. Next, we learned about our emotions and how to keep them small instead of allowing them to get too big. We made emotion puppets and learned poems to help us calm down. We harvested potatoes and saw carrots growing in the preschool garden.

The following week we began Letter of the Week with letter A. We made apple pudding and tastetested red, yellow and green apples. We saw the shape apple seeds make when an apple is cut in half (ask your student what it is) and we made aliens and acorns. It was fun to begin having Show and Tell.

For letter F week, we talked about fall, made a fall tree project and sang fall songs. We shared a family photo for Show and Tell and wore flannel on Friday. We also enjoyed a field trip to Bauman's Family Apple Butter Factory. Thank you to the Bauman family for the snack of apple butter and apple cider.

October began with Letter O and making owls. We wore caps to school and made colorful corn for letter C. During the rest of this month, we will fingerpaint pumpkins, taste pumpkin seeds and carve a pumpkin for letter P. For letter S we will have Silly Sock Day, make a life-sized scarecrow and sunflowers. Eastern Berks Fire Company will visit and we will end the month by making hot air balloons and talking about homes for letter H.

In November we will talk about M, N and T. We will make corn muffins, noodle necklaces, Thanksgiving placemats and turkey headbands. It will be fun to prepare for Friendsgiving Day as we learn about the first Thanksgiving and how to work together.

We are grateful for the good weather so we can enjoy our playground and the new mulch. Thank you to Bally Mennonite Church for replacing the mulch! Mrs. LaSalle and I are enjoying spending time with your children and look forward to seeing how much each child will grow this year.

Each week we practice saying hello "hola", go over the calendar, season and sing songs to go with them. We end our time together with the goodbye song and saying "adios".

We started the year with "palabras de maneras", manners and expressions words. They really enjoyed the games we played to reinforce these words. Our second theme of the year is learning "colores", colors. The three-year-old class will learn six color words and the four-year-old class will learn 11 words. We will make color books which will be a great way to keep practicing at home. After that we will learn "formas", shapes. What a privilege to teach Spanish to your children!
